7-7:45pm - Board Meeting

- Treasurer's Report
 - o Taken in \$14K
 - Dumpster Days \$1.6K this year vs. \$3K last year
 - Motion to send Mike to fire and safety conference approved
 - Mike to follow up afterwards with write up of lessons/how to implement
 - Big goal of the conference to find out how to get the community and lot owners more involved
- Update from Architecture Committee
 - Variance note card sent to some residents those owners never contacted the committee, so that was news to us
- Bylaws and elections
 - Motion to amend bylaws approved
 - Reviewed in June by board
 - Main changes: eliminated some inconsistencies; cleaned up so it supports all of the residents in all the plats
 - Lauren will get recorded
 - Elections
 - Mailing in September:
 - Announce the election in November
 - Call for nominees
 - Limit of 30 days to nominate
 - Share news via email and Facebook as well
 - Send out ballots in mid-October
 - Vote at annual meeting in November
 - Need a total of 5 board members at a minimum
- Debrief from Dumpster Days and Firewise events
 - What worked, what did not work?
 - More signage, more advertising
 - Need more volunteers!!!!
 - Start enforcing limits on how many dumpster runs people take
 - 14 dumpsters all were full
 - Moose café to cater worked well would like to use again next year
 - Not as many people as we would have hoped
 - How can we improve in future years?
 - Start advertising early
 - Have a minimum of 6-8 volunteers or else the event gets canceled
 - Hang up the banner to sign up for volunteering
 - Keep the location of OnTop for FireWise
- Chipping program

- The fire department is shutting this program down earlier than normal and there are still many homes with green waste piles in their yards
 - Would like to send a letter to Doug Kline and Glen Wright from the HOA
- HOA is looking to hire a private company to come and pick up those piles/chip
 - Mike has reached out to Zach at Royal to take everything out and have it chipped (\$1,200/day)
 - Next steps:
 - Getting two more bids
 - Pick the dates
 - Notify the neighbors
- Update on the FireWise grants
 - Paid three people \$1,375
 - Have one more interested that Mike is going to look at
 - Leaves six up for grabs for the remainder of this summer
- Lessons from Tollgate Fire
 - Emergency exits and crash gates where are they located and who has access to open?
 - Three emergency exits -
 - Short Stack:
 - Gate is too secure; it is a county road, but the lock cannot be cut; would like to turn into a crash gate; Basin Rec has a gate they can donate
 - Basin Rec and Summit Park HOA to send letter stating concern
 - Timberline:
 - Three locks (fire department, private)
 - Want to make it a crash gate, need to reach out to the HOA at Timberline
 - Pinebrook:
 - Jess has the key and it is already a crash gates
 - Evacuation signs
 - Can be supplied by Basin Rec but Summit Park HOA/Summit County to hang them
 - We need to work with Basin to get the signs, figure out the place to put them
 - What can homeowners do? Make a plan, Reverse 911 (what is the best way to do that?),
 Firewise grants, wood chipping, etc.
 - 0-5 feet and work your way out; open up the canopy
 - Share our helpful articles more often
 - New Reverse 911 website by the county: summitcountyalerts.org
 - Other potential community projects:
 - Clearing brush over easement along the roads (both paved and fire roads), would need to work with the county
 - Emergency safe zone

7:45pm - open up to community Q&A

- Parking at trailheads Brian and Katie
 - Parking at Matterhorn trailhead has become overwhelming; 27 cars tonight as they left their house; unable at times to get in and out of their driveway
 - Suggested solution: No parking on one side of the street

• Next steps: Brian, Katie and Jackie to help give statements and photos of the issue. HOA can reach out to the Sherriff and county with photos and proposed solutions.

Basin Rec Letter -

- Gathering support/looking for partners for new grant (summer 2019)
- Forest health and fuel reduction program through the watershed restoration association part of the division of wildlife
- Funding for 3-5 years
- Support in two ways:
 - We can be a partner by just supporting
 - Active partner could use the projects we are already funding (Inkind or money donation to the grant)
- Give us money for education, resources, some of it can be outreach; garlic mustard; fire mitigation, etc.
- Grant is due in January
- Watershed, county, many others getting asked to be involved as well
