## Community Q&A

- Low Stump is now an approved contractor for Firewise grants
- Matt from Burn Smart Summit County wood burning program
  - $\circ$   $\;$  When wood is burned, over 200 different chemicals are released
  - Burning 10 lbs of wood releases the same amount of toxins as smoking 120K cigarettes
  - Burning wood contributes to GHG one wood burning stove = the same amount as 3K homes with natural gas
  - Summit County is really at the edge of what's acceptable by the EPA
  - New builds don't allow wood burning stoves
  - Grant from the EPA to replace wood burning stoves with cleaner options
  - Incentive: can give anywhere between \$250-\$4K, depends on the income and the scope of work (whether a gas line needs to be put in, etc.)
  - Purple Air monitors
  - Summitcountyhealth.org/burn-smart/
  - Aaron Campbell from Spoil to Soil Composting
    - Offers weekly composting and give compost back to you if you want it
    - The landfill doesn't want food waste, it creates a lot of methane, etc.
    - Donate the rest of the compost to nonprofits in the area
    - Within the next 5-7 years, there will likely be drastic changes on how people dispose of the waste

- If you want to reduce your carbon footprint, it's one of the most impactful things you can do
- Looking to get small digester can suck out the methane, can sell the gas and then can create pellets out of that pure biomass that can get burned in wood burning stoves
- Concern about lack of lights on exit 140 for I-80 with the truck stop
  - Been out since December
  - Megan will work on sending an email to UDOT, RMP and County
- Trailheads
  - New trailheads, hammocks, fire pits, etc.
  - 58 cars in one evening
