Mike reminded folks to clear fire hydrants.

Parking at Parkview/Matterhorn

Sheriff has stepped up ticketing enforcement. Need signs about where to park and not park. Maybe revisit parking above the gate. Need to educate folks about parking issues. There was a suggestion to have a shuttle to the trail heads. Maybe have sheriff deputize ticket writer in Summit Park.

Jessica Kirby from Basin Rec said they have secured a grant for parking lot at Discovery development to be built next year.

Pinebrook allows ebikes, although SP doesn't; the problem is that people don't know where Pinebrook trails end and SP trails begin.

Goats will be used in Toll Canyon to eat oak brush for 3 1/2 weeks in July; there will be guard dogs with them, so hikers should limit dogs.

Sara Jo, Summit Co Weed Control, brought a handout and made a presentation. 100 acres were weeded for garlic mustard; 300 acres were treated with herbicide. Knapweed was also treated.
