



PUBLIC INFORMATION NOTICE SUMMIT PARK RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Summit County Public Works in conjunction with Mountain Regional Water and Snyderville Basin Water Reclamation District is preparing to begin another phase of reconstruction of infrastructure within the Summit Park Subdivision. The reconstruction includes replacing the water lines, sewer lines, and road repair. The project will be starting about the third week of May. The project should be completed by about the first part of October.

The project will include water line replacement along Saint Moritz Strasse from Parkview Drive to Saint Moritz Way. A sewer line replacement along Matterhorn Dr from Matterhorn Circle to 305 Matterhorn Drive. The area within these project limits will be closed to all but existing residents within the project. Recommended detours will be posted. There will be times when open trenches will limit access to properties within the project limits, however the contractor will coordinate with the affected property owners to keep them informed. Access through construction areas may also be restricted at times during evening hours. We recommend that you follow the detours even during the evening hours. The project will reconstruct the roadway with a new driving surface after completion of the water and sewer line work.

The project will also include water service replacements along Aspen Dr from 200 Aspen Dr to 380 Aspen Dr. This work is primarily on the shoulder and will not require a full road closure but will have occasions that will require lanes closures and flagging operations.

Summit County will also have separate maintenance projects within the Summit Park Subdivision to rehabilitate the driving surface of some roads. Asphalt overlays are scheduled on Paradise Rd, Upper Evergreen, Evergreen Circle and Crestview Lane. Slurry Seals are scheduled on Saint Moritz Circle, Saint Moritz Strasse (from Matterhorn to End) Saint Moritz Terrace and Parkview Drive (Saint Moritz Strasse to Matterhorn Dr). This work will also require short term closures (1 day) during the application.
